Custom-made and modified Freedom Wheels bikes and trikes provide individuals with disabilities the opportunity to experience bike riding, sometimes for the first time in their lives. Many of our clients face challenges with walking independently, yet they can enjoy the thrill of riding with the appropriate assistance. Our health professionals prescribe Freedom Wheels bikes, and each one is meticulously crafted to accommodate the unique requirements of every individual, including their height, weight, and therapeutic needs. We believe that everyone should have the chance to enjoy the freedom of cycling.

Unique Solutions

Technical volunteers from Freedom Solutions collaborate with individuals with disabilities to create tailored assistive technology, either by crafting custom devices or adapting existing equipment, in order to enhance their overall quality of life or assist them in achieving specific objectives. Our Impact

Freedom Wheels Leo's story <

Leo, an 11-year-old boy with the spirit of a calm whale navigating the ocean, a story unfolds—a tale of resilience, discovery, and the transformative power of Freedom Wheels. Leo, born with Down Syndrome, likes to be in a quiet environment and loves to dance like no one is watching him. Before the advent of Freedom Wheels, Leo, an indoor enthusiast, found joy in the quiet corners of his home. However, a pivotal moment came when Leo, now equipped with his own Freedom Wheels bicycle, experienced a newfound motivation to explore the world outside. Riding became not just a physical activity but a catalyst for confidence and community interaction.

The journey began when Leo's family discovered Freedom Wheels during a free bicycle day at the traffic school in Kew when he was five. Since then, Leo's life has seen positive transformations. While still in the training stages, Leo's confidence in riding has grown, and his school reports echo his newfound enthusiasm for cycling.

Freedom Wheels, with its personalised approach, has played a pivotal role in Leo's journey. Our commitment to meeting individual needs has not only empowered Leo but also positively impacted his family. The ripple effect of this support extends beyond personal growth—it contributes to the beauty of interdependence, where supporting others becomes a source of happiness for all.




Photography is more than just capturing moments; it's about expressing oneself, preserving memories, and connecting with the world.

For Thai, photography is more than just a hobby; it's a passion. However, Thai had to recently stop taking photos due to his disability.. Thai lives with muscular dystrophy. He spends most of his day in his wheelchair, and experiences muscular weakness and fragility. His camera was starting to be too heavy for him to hold:

"The camera I used was too heavy, weighing a total of 2,090 grams with the lens attached, making it challenging for me to hold the camera and thus I wasn't able to take photos."

Working in co-design with Thai, our occupational therapy team and a team of volunteers, a custom mount was designed and prototyped. The result was a meticulously crafted mount that allowed the camera to sit comfortably, enabling Thai to take photos while being seated in his wheelchair without the burden of its weight.

The mount was created with various materials, attaching to the side of his wheelchair. The mount can be adjusted and moved, to best position the camera.



Since receiving his custom mount, Thai's quality of life has significantly increased. Despite the design being a simple solution, the final result has provided to be invaluable, as explained by Thai himself:

"In the last 2 months, this mount has given me the opportunity to explore photography, enabling me to engage with photographer communities, capturing photos, and create work that fills me with pride. This camera setup has been truly transformative. I find myself going out more, engaging in social activities, and becoming an active member of communities I deeply appreciate. Words cannot describe how much this has changed my life. I had no idea this was an option for me at all before I met Freedom Solutions."

We have loved working with Thai, and he is extremely eager to continue building a life of independence.

He also transitioned into project management, travelling both interstate and internationally. Despite his busy career, Bob and his wife raised six children, making their lives even busier.

Bob's passion for volunteering with Freedom Solutions was ignited by the desire to use his technical background to make a difference in the lives of those with disabilities. He believes that providing individuals with custom equipment suited to their needs can offer a sense of freedom and independence. This is especially true for people who have been struggling with their disabilities for years, relying heavily on caregivers and ill-fitting equipment.

One of Bob's favourite projects was designing a custom walker for a woman with only one functional arm. With the help of Joanne, another Freedom Solutions volunteer, they created a walker that provided elbow support and a single handle. The woman could manoeuvre the walker easily and even walk through tight spaces, giving her newfound independence.

Bob enjoys working with the volunteer group, as they collaborate on projects, offer technical support, and share resources. This collaborative environment fosters success and enables volunteers to continuously learn from one another.

When asked what the word 'freedom' means to him, Bob says it's about providing individuals with self-satisfaction and self-importance by giving them the ability to achieve something on their own. The custom equipment designed by volunteers like Bob can grant a level of freedom to those in need, making a profound difference in their lives.
